As allergy season is underway in both hemispheres, please remain alert to potential asthma exacerbations in your patients.

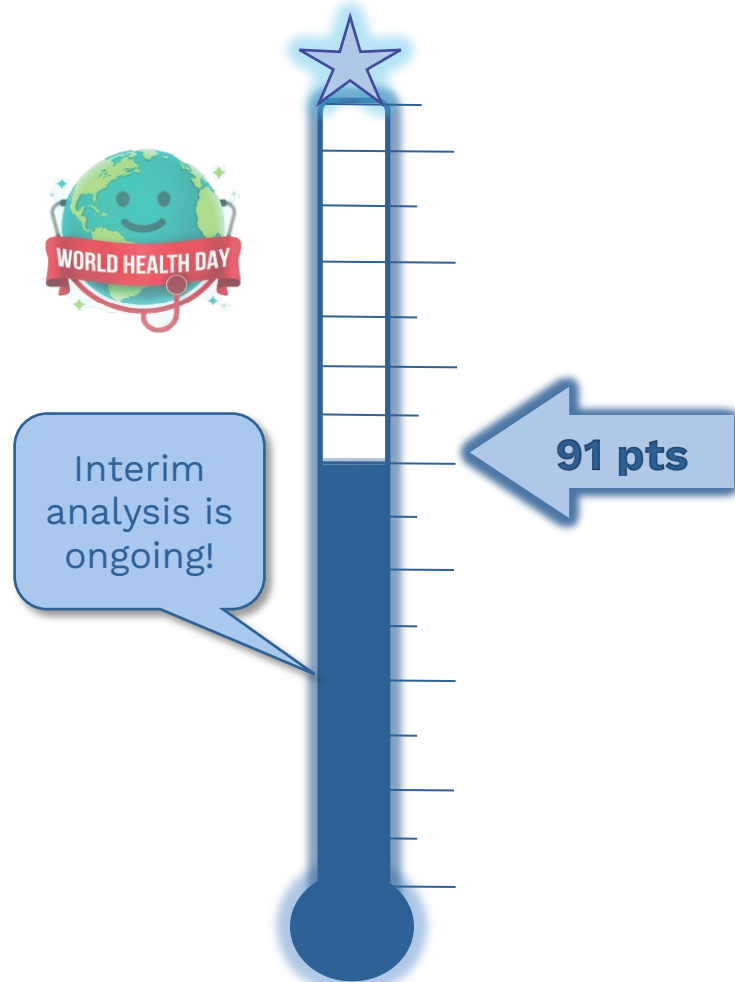
Randomizations increased from **42 to 91** in the past month.

Question & Answers

Q. When should the Treatment Failure log form be completed?

A: Sites should enter a treatment failure when it happens, recording the first occurrence of each treatment failure type. As the study continues, the form should be updated as applicable. In other words, it is not a one-time use form. When the participant exits the study, please review the Treatment Failure form at End of Trial to make sure all information is accurate and up to date.

Q. Is there a specific order of assessments at each visit?

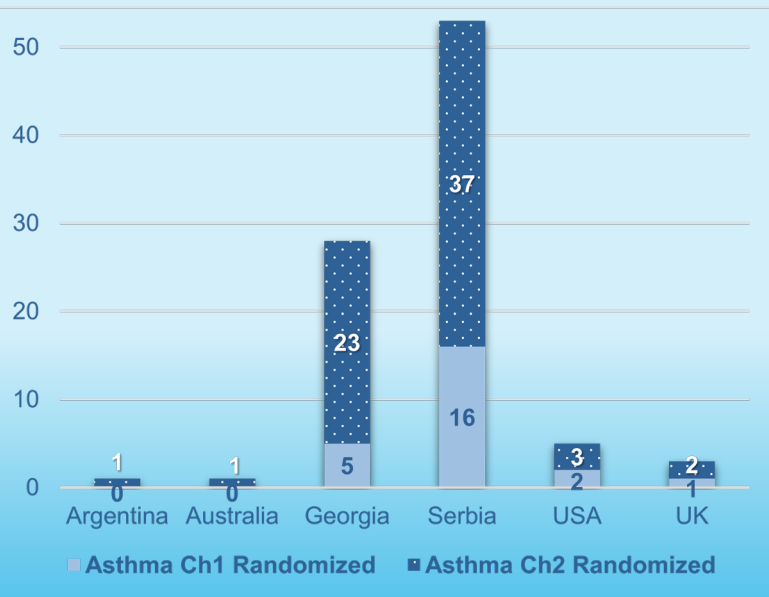
A: Section 10.3 provides the ideal sequence of assessments. However, during the Screening Visit (Visit 1b) and/or the Randomization Visit (Visit 2), this order may be modified as needed, including instances where some or all these procedures are performed as part of routine/urgent/inpatient hospitalized care. Where possible at Visit 1b, it is advisable to obtain eosinophil count prior to the administration of corticosteroids if it does not compromise patient safety.

Q: Does the withholding of maintenance therapies for pre-bronchodilator (pre-BD) spirometry assessments apply to the Screening Visit 1a, given that Footnote “t” only references Visits 5, 6, 8, 9, and day of discharge?

A: Yes. The timelines for withholding maintenance therapy outlined in protocol Section 10.3 apply to all study visits requiring pre-BD spirometry including Screening Visit 1a, unless explicitly contraindicated for patient safety. The mention in Footnote “t” of Visits 5, 6, 8, 9, and day of discharge (hospitalized participants) is intended to provide operational flexibility for participants recovering from an acute asthma exacerbation, where strict bronchodilator restrictions may not always be clinically appropriate. Visit 1a is for stable participants; therefore, withholding the maintenance therapy should not put the participant at risk. As a reminder, the Screening Visit 1a spirometry test may be repeated up to 3 times within 2 weeks.

- ❖ **Reminder:** Submit pre-screening log forms to your CRA on a weekly basis.
